Hello Project! My name is Lauren Whitney, and I am the new math teacher at Huntley Project Schools. I work with students throughout the 8th-12th grade in Algebra I, Algebra II, and Consumer Math. I am so happy to be here and look forward to being a part of the community of Huntley Project.

Right now in math, we are diving into a variety of topics. Algebra I is starting a probability and statistics unit where we will discover the probabilities of simple and compound events, tree diagrams, and organizing data by finding the mean, median, and mode. Students will also play the Cheyenne Basket Game as well as Fantasy Baseball.

Algebra II is knee deep in a unit on matrices. Matrices are a convenient way to organize and analyze data, so they are learning how to do operations with matrices and then will be looking at data to make business decisions based on their calculations.

Consumer math is finishing up a unit on cash purchases. Over Thanksgiving week students are going to calculate the total and unit price of a Thanksgiving dinner, taking into account any specials or coupons they can find.
